PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, well run treatment courts have shown to be successful at intervention for people with substance use and mental health disorders, promoting lives of recovery, stability, and health; and

WHEREAS, treatment courts strive to combine accountability with evidence-based treatment that can improve substance use disorder treatment outcomes, reduce addiction and related crime; and

WHEREAS, treatment courts may improve education, employment, housing, financial stability, promote family reunification, and reduce foster care placements; and

WHEREAS, local data on efficiency, effectiveness and cost savings is imperative to demonstrate success of programs and protect local taxpayers dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Misdemeanor DWI/Drug Court has been in existence since 2006 and has served 675 participants with 548 successful graduates and 13 currently active in the program; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Veterans Treatment Court has been in existence since 2015 and has served 275 participants with 214 successful graduates and 39 currently active in the program; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Transformative Justice Program Court has been in existence since 2019 and has served 142 participants with 67 successful graduates and 37 currently active in the program; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Felony DWI/Drug Court has been in existence since 2019 and has served 113 participants with 72 successful graduates and 25 currently active in the program; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Felony Mental Health Docket has been in existence since 2019 and has served 58 participants with 23 successful graduates and 21 currently active in the program; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Family Recovery Court accepted its first participant in 2021 and has 6 current participants and 6 successful graduate families who have been reunified.

THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED; that the Williamson County Commissioners Court recognizes May as Treatment Court Month in Williamson County.
